Headteacher's Update

Dear Parents/Carers,

I can't believe we are coming to the end of the first term! It has been a great start to the new school year with lots of exciting things going on in school. Thank you for the support you have given to your children in their learning and coming into school for different events including parents' evening this term. It is much appreciated and makes a real difference.

Harvest

Well done to Year 3 who led our Harvest Assembly all about apples. The afternoon included sharing work, interesting facts about apples, a short play and ended with sharing apple muffins with families. Thank you for coming along to the afternoon – it was thoroughly enjoyed by all!

Homework

Thank you for supporting your children in the revised homework this term. Most children in the infants are reading almost daily with an adult at home and juniors several times per week. Children have completed creative and interesting homework activities in different classes this term. Thank you for doing these activities with your child – many children and parents have said how much they enjoy them and prefer the choice of activities too. Junior children are enjoying learning their tables through the Superhero Challenges and are completing their MyMaths and other online homework. If you need any help or advice about homework or reading, please talk to your child's teacher.

Whitehall

Year 5 pupils had an amazing time visiting Whitehall Outdoor Education Centre. They took part in various adventurous activities such as high ropes, den building, archery and team building. It would be fair to say, some children were a little nervous about taking part in some of the activities; however, everyone showed great courage, determination and teamwork. Online Safety and Mobile Phones

We have been aware of incidents where children who have Instagram and similar apps, posting photographs of other children without permission. We strongly advise that the use of Instagram and similar apps are not appropriate for primary age children and make it makes them vulnerable online. Children are taught about online safety as part of our curriculum, including the potential dangers and how to keep themselves safe online. Please take time during the holiday to discuss online safety with your child and check what your child is using and doing online regularly. We do not allow children to have mobile phones in school; however, we are aware that occasionally children may bring their phone to school if they are staying with a different family member. Therefore, we ask that children leave their mobiles in the office with Jane Brzozowski until the end of the day.



Healthy School Communities Award

We were very pleased to receive recognition for our work promoting healthy eating and healthy lifestyles and were presented the Derbyshire Healthy School Communities Award for improving health and wellbeing across the school community. Special thanks to Mrs McNamara who arranged the Healthy Choices Day in the summer which was a huge success. To achieve the award, we had to demonstrate that the school had improved health and wellbeing; our focus areas are: healthy food choices, playground buddies and enterprise. Nursery

The new Nursery is up and running. Children have settled well into school and enjoy a range of playbased learning activities in nursery and beyond. They have visited the main school several times and have been for walks in the woods. The school nursery caters for children aged 3-4 and rising threes (children can start during the term in which they will have their third birthday). Sessions are from 9am until 12 noon, and 12.30pm until 3.30pm. Children can use their 15 hours 'universal' with us, as well as the full 30 hours for those eligible. Playdays are able to provide Breakfast and After School provision for nursery children. Special thanks to Mrs McNamara for arranging the Healthy Choices day and making our school a happy and healthy place to learn!






As part of their topic work on the senses, the Reception children went on a Gruffalo listening walk in the woods.
