Headteacher's Update

Dear Parents/Carers

A very Happy New Year to you all! We hope you have enjoyed the Christmas break. The new term has started very well, with all the children working hard and enjoying their new topics.

Time Capsule

Just over twenty years ago, in December 1999, to celebrate the new millennium, a time capsule was buried in our school grounds. Children who were at the school at the time wrote letters and put them into the capsule. They were given a certificate, which they were asked to return as proof that they had a letter in the capsule. On Tuesday 4th February at 6pm, we are inviting former pupils of the school the opportunity to come into school and collect their letters.

In assembly, we have been thinking about how we find out about the past, and in the coming weeks, our current children will be working on items to bury in our new capsule, which will be buried at a later date and opened in another 20 years!

Travel Smart

As part of our school Travel Plan, we are promoting walking to school, cycling and scooting, as alternatives to travelling by car. We are always keen to share ideas and promote ways of improving children's health and fitness, as well as reducing congestion caused by traffic on and around the school site. We appreciate that some of our families live too far away to walk to school; however, you could try 'park and stride', where you park within walking distance of school and walk the rest of the way. Some groups of parents/carers have set up their own Whatsapp groups to advise other parents of lift sharing and adults to walk children to school.

We want to encourage children to cycle or scoot to school; however, please can we remind you to remind your children to take extra care when entering the playground and on the pavements and roads near the school entrance as it can become guite busy at the start and end of the day.

Some of our children have had new tablets, gaming consoles etc for Christmas. This is a good time to check your parental controls and security settings and to talk with your children about online safety.
