Dear Parents/Carers

#### Welcome!

#### Parents' Evenings

Thank you for attending parents' evenings, either in person, virtually or over the phone. I am pleased to say that the vast majority of teachers have spoken to 100% of their parents/carers which is fantastic and shows just how supportive Harpur families are of their children's learning. If you have not yet been able to speak to your child's teacher, please get in touch and an appointment can be arranged.

#### **Start and End of Day Arrangements**

After Easter, we will be making a few changes to the start and end of the school day so that the majority of pupils use the main pedestrian gate (next to the park).

All classes (apart from Miss Wallace's Reception class 1, Miss Marsh's Year 1 and Miss Carver's Year 3 class) will enter and exit through the main pedestrian gate. Nursery will continue to use the small pedestrian gate.

Please may we remind you of the following:

- Do not congregate in groups outside the school gates and send your child straight into school as soon as you arrive, to avoid congestion
- Walk to school wherever possible to reduce the amount of traffic on the roads outside school
- Older children may cycle or scoot to school
- Take care when driving outside school or on the main car park
- Do not block gates or access to the school
- Park safely and considerately, without blocking pavements and driveways.
- Although not enforced, but endorsed by the Police, it helps to reduce congestion if more people observe the following one-way system - please enter via Trent Avenue road and exit using Ferneydale Avenue onto Fernway, exit onto Harpur Hill Road.
- Take extra care in the car park and make sure younger children are supervised by an adult

## **SCHOOL NEWS**

#### **Nursery**





The children have been learning about food, they have listened to stories relating to food, such as, Oliver's Vegetables and Oliver's Fruit Salad. They even prepared and ate their own fruit salad and vegetable soup. The children in nursery celebrated Shrove Tuesday. They listened to the story 'Mr Wolf's Pancakes' and then made their own batter using flour, eggs and milk. They enjoyed eating their pancakes at snack time with syrup, lemon and a little sprinkle of sugar.

The children have been very busy planting seeds to grow peas, and have started their own potato patch. They are very excited to see the vegetables beginning to grow.

#### Reception





The children in Reception had an amazing time with Jungle Jo. Jo brought along some special visitors for us to look at and hold. The children were so brave and learnt lots of wonderful facts about creatures that live in the jungle!

#### Year 1 and 2



This half term the Year 1 children have been learning about wheels and axles in D&T. They have explored how to make axles and axle holders and have now finished making their own moving vehicle.

The Year 2 children have been learning about different linkages and finding out which is the best type of linkage for particular purposes. They have designed and made their own moving monster, using a pivot linkage. Great work everyone!

#### Year 3

Rowan Class have had an enjoyable half term, really enjoying their history work on ancient Egypt. They have learned all about the process of mummification. The children loved mummifying oranges, and found it trickier than they thought it would be. They have also learned about how Ancient Egyptian artwork, paintings, hieroglyphs and artefacts with pictures on such as canopic jars and jugs are evidence to help historians and archaeologists work out how they lived. They created some wonderful pictures of Queen Nefertiti.

The class also enjoyed an informative afternoon finding out about some more recent and far more local history, at Pavilion Gardens. They learned all about the Octagon being built, the car park being on the site of what was a skating rink, and their highlight - singing 'Three Little Birds', on the Octagon stage, where the Beatles once performed.



#### Year 3 & 4

In English, we have enjoyed reading exciting adventures from How to Train your Dragon, by Cressida Cowell. Our class novel, The Boy who made the World Disappear, is coming to a very interesting end. In art, we have progressed in our drawing skills by sketching castles, linked to our Norman history topic.



We depicted scenes from the Bayeaux Tapestry when we shared some of our learning to an audience as we invite parents to our presentation of learning on Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> April. We shared facts from our topic and sang songs from our music lessons.

#### Year 4 & 5 Brass



Well done to all our Year 4 and 5 brass players for an excellent performance at the Octagon in the Primary School Showcase with the Peak District Music Centre last Friday afternoon.

The children played with other primary schools in a concert which also included the Peak District Big Band and Peak District String Orchestra.

#### Year 5

The children have had a very busy half term learning about the Anglo Saxons and Beowulf.

They enjoyed a visit from Enrichment through Archaeology in which they learnt all about the life of an archaeologist. The children have also enjoyed researching plants in their science topic 'Space'.









#### Year 6

This term, Oak and Maple classes have produced some amazing pictures inspired by the painting 'Surprise' by Henri Rousseau.



In Topic, we have learned about Rainforests and researched the animals that live in rainforests and countries where they are found, we also included writing a newspaper report on deforestation.

In science, we have been learning about Living Things and their Habitats. In English, we have been reading The Explorer by Katherine Rundell, this is an amazing book about a group of children who are lost in the Amazon rainforest. We have written a balanced argument, a non-chronological report, a poem and a story on this theme! In Maths, we have worked on shape and angles.

We have had a fantastic term and the children have again worked hard preparing for their SATs next term. As featured in the





Harpur Hill School seeks ex-pupils for 70th anniversary oral history project.

A Buxton Primary School is appealing for past pupils to share memories of their classroom days for an oral history project celebrating the organisation's 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary.

The first cohort of junior age pupils arrived at the Harpur Hill School, on the Trent Avenue site in September 1952, the same year that Queen Elizabeth came to the throne. Present day pupils are working on projects to mark both anniversaries, assembling archive materials, which tell the school's story, and now they looking to document the experiences of

previous generations who passed through the same halls.

Governor Anne Rogerson, who also leads the Buxton& District U3A Oral History group which has produced numerous records of local life, is working with year three teacher Lis Carver to develop the idea.

She said: "One focus of the project will be to find stories from past pupils who will talk to us about their school days. We would like this to take the form of the children asking the questions and believe this will mine a rich seam of memories.

"Unfortunately, most people always underestimate the value of their own story, so it is that issue we need to overcome. Any snippet of information on any aspect of school life will all be valuable, for example lessons taught, playground games, school dinners, school trips, prizes, school uniform."

She added: "We need people from all seven decades if possible to present the whole story of development."

## **SPORT**

Happy end of term everybody.

Nursery have explored moving around in different ways this half term using different equipment and different body parts!

Our Reception classes have been exploring gymnastics focusing on balancing, rolls, shapes and jumps whilst our Year 1 and 2 children have been further exploring more technical aspects and partner work. They finished off with some individual routines, which were amazing!

Our Year 3 children have explored netball and basketball, learning how to pass, move and dribble in the sports before playing some small-sided games.

Our Year 4 children have started to explore invasion games, working through hockey and football and started to understand how to attack and defend as individuals and a team.

Year 5 worked hard learning about netball and basketball focusing on tactics, rules of the game and playing to win.

Lastly, our Year 6 children started to link how some invasion sport tactics can be used in other sports, football, rugby and hockey were our focus, and we explored some game-like situations.

Football after school club has been lots of fun with a KS1 group who started to play some matches as well as learning about dribbling and passing with Coach Gabe. Our KS2 group worked on their shooting and crossing as well as lots of games!

During this last week of term, we encouraged our Year 5 and 6 children to cycle to school as part of a cycling week. Some of our Year 4 children attended Map Quest at the Pavilion Gardens and had a lovely afternoon orienteering!
