We have welcomed several new children to our school in recent weeks and we have more new starters due to join us in September, along with the new Reception children. A very warm welcome to you all!

Sports

We have had an amazing year for Sports, achieving our Gold award from the School Games Mark once again. Coach Danny has developed our PE curriculum and sport across the school, resulting in children being more active enjoying their PE lessons. We have had a fantastic year of competitive sports too - we are the High Peak champions of Basketball, Girls' Football, Quad-Kids and Cross Country; and Buxton Champions in all the above and more. A huge thank you and well done to all the children who have represented our school this year, and also to Danny!

Music

Well done to all of our young musicians. This year we have had lots of children playing instruments – all of Year 4 learned brass, some Year 5 continued brass, other children are having individual or group lessons on woodwind, cello, violin and guitar, or joined ukulele club.



We have a range of musical opportunities available for children from September:

- Children from Year 2 upwards may learn to play a string instrument – we currently offer violin and cello lessons, and double bass by arrangement. These lessons can be held individually or in pairs/small groups
- Children from Year 3 upwards are invited to learn the clarinet in a lunchtime clarinet club. Ben Simnett, our woodwind teacher will be sending out more information in September
- Darren Lloyd teaches brass open to Year 5 & 6
- Dave Morten teaches guitar to children from Year 2 upwards
- Year 5 children may access subsidised lessons (either continuing their brass instrument or learning a new one) as they have been part of the Wider Opportunities programme in Y4

Nursery - Bear Cubs

The Bear Cubs have enjoyed lots of messy play activities and exploring the outdoors. We have invited lots of new families for taster sessions and are very excited to welcome all of our new children after the summer.



Nursery - Brilliant Bears

The children in pre-school have had a brilliant half-term exploring their 'Under the Sea' topic. They have especially enjoyed finding ways to keep cool during the warm weather! The children have enjoyed their transition visits to Reception and are excited to start school in September.

The children in nursery have been reading the story Clem and Crab. They have been very worried about the amount of rubbish that is found in the ocean and on the beaches. They have learnt about recycling and have been looking for the recycling logo on different packaging, before sorting it in to the correct recycling bin. They have even been busy collecting rubbish from our school grounds, using grabbers to pick it up and put it in to the bin

Reception



Reception have been learning about changes as we grow. We have enjoyed sharing baby photos of ourselves and discussing how we have changed and how we might change in the future.

Through reading the story Somebody Swallowed Stanley we have learnt about pollution in the sea and the effect it has on the environment.

We shared our own personal experiences of going on holiday and made posters advising people how to stay safe at the seaside. We have enjoyed doing more writing and particularly enjoyed writing about what we could hear/see at the seaside.

Year 1

The Jolly Giraffes have had a super year. We have enjoyed exploring Brilliant Buxton and enjoyed lots of artwork during this topic including sketching, painting and making clay pots! We thoroughly enjoyed the 'Is Art Everywhere?' topic with a visit from the Northern Ballet to learn dance skills and a trip to Buxton Opera House to watch Pinocchio. Our Dragons topic was a huge favourite with the children, and they enjoyed learning about how to care for pets and animals and they loved holding a range of animals with our visit from 'Animal Magic'. The Summer Term has flown by; we enjoyed our Sports Day, visits to our new classes and learning all about weather in hot and cold countries.



Year 2



The Marvellous Monkeys have had a fantastic year! We started off our year exploring what is Brilliant about Buxton, followed by what it was like during the Victorian times. We really enjoyed developing our art skills during this topic including sketching and painting, and learning about a Victorian Christmas.

We successfully completed our Arts Award through our topic 'Is Art Everywhere?' and our favourite parts were definitely the visit from the Northern Ballet and our school trip to Buxton Opera House to watch Pinocchio.

Our Dragons topic was another favourite, and we enjoyed learning about how to care for pets and animals and they loved holding a range of animals with our visit from 'Animal Magic'. In the Summer Term, we thoroughly enjoyed dressing up for our Inspirational People Day and learning about how different people have changed history. In the last few weeks of term, we have had lots of fun taking part in Sports Day, getting ready for Year 3 and visiting our new classroom.

Year 3



Rowan Class have really enjoyed their final term in Year 3. They have been fascinated by the Greek Myths that they have learned as part of their 'What is the Ancient Greek's Legacy for Today?' topic. They have taken part in an Ancient Greek Olympic Games activity chariot racing, sprinting and discus throwing. They have designed some lovely Greek vases after looking at historical sources and understanding how the pictures on the pottery helps us to understand daily life, clothes and food in Ancient Greece.

Some of the children took part in a Commonwealth themed games morning at Chesterfield, taking part in archery, body zorbing, laser tag, team building games, cricket and rugby skills.




Year 3&4

Ash and Willow had a most wonderful time at Mossy Lea. The children learned about countryside safety, respect and enjoyment. This included watching hunting dogs responding to the ranger and learning about fire safety from the fire brigade. We looked at the impact on the conditions of soils when they are saturated from water and when they are dried out. We learned to recognise bird calls and saw a range of birds of prey.



Year 5



Elm and Ash classes have expanded their history knowledge this half term, exploring 'What did we learn from the Great Plague?'.

The children visited Eyam and learnt about the different families and their sacrifices

Both classes have looked at the symptoms of the plague and the strange ideas they had to cure them.

Many children created their medicines as part of their long term projects.



Year 6 enjoyed a residential visit to Lea Green. They faced their fears on the high ropes and left with many memories.

The Year 6 performed the musical of Charlie and the Chocolate Factory last week. They had a fantastic time and all took part: as the characters, in the chorus or as stagehands. This was the end of what has been a busy and exciting year for our Year 6 children.

This week Year 6 designed and built water rockets which they launched before having a giant water fight in the playground.

ADMINISTRATION

Absence and medical appointment procedures, if your child is unwell or unable to attend school for whatever reason, please inform us as soon as possible, before 9am. You can contact us to report an absence by: - phoning the school office 01298 23261 (you can leave a message on the answer machine if you phone before the office is open)

- emailing - sreception@harpurhill.derbyshire.sch.uk - texting school on 07786 207779 or by replying to a school text.

Kindly let the school know any changes in you address/telephone/email details, so we can amend records to enable you to receive texts/emails.

Research shows that the higher a child's attendance, the better they do in school; and this in turn improves their life chances. During the pandemic, as in all schools, our attendance was affected by absences due to coronavirus and other covid-related issues/illnesses. Prior to the pandemic, our attendance was above the national average.

New national guidance has been introduced for schools to follow from September, and we will continue to follow procedures from Derbyshire County Council about the issue of penalty notices for unauthorised absences. Holidays during term time will not be authorised. Leave of absence may be requested for exceptional circumstances and may be authorised if there are exceptional circumstances. We will be reintroducing our attendance awards for improved attendance and a termly award for 100% attendance. Let's aim to keep our attendance well above the national average again so Harpur children can make the most of their learning! Thank you for your support.

Lateness

The morning register is taken at 9am; children are expected to be in school prior to this and ready for the start of the school day. To see how lateness can affect your child's education, see below:

Minutes late per day	Equivalent of missing
10 Minutes	6 school days a year
15 Minutes	10 school days a year
20 Minutes	14 school days a year
30 Minutes	20 school days a year

Parking Issues and Road Safety

In order to keep your children safe, please may we remind you to:

- Take care when driving on the school site and nearby roads
- Please park safely and considerately do not block, driveways, footpaths or roads
- Do not park in disabled spaces these are only for badge holders
- · Please drop your child and leave fairly quickly to make room for other parents/carers
- Keep younger children with you and do not let them run around in the car park or roads near the school

We know that the majority of parents/carers park considerately and safely – thank you. Children can be dropped off between 8.45am and 9am to allow more time for the drop off. Also, you may like to consider the following:

- Walk or cycle to school when you can
- Use parent or neighbourhood groups on social media etc such as Whatsapp to arrange a walking bus or take it in turn to bring each other's children to school
- Park a little further away from school and walk the last five minutes to avoid the roads next to school

In recent weeks, both the Police and Fire Service have patrolled and spoken to a few drivers about parking. They asked us to remind parents/carers to park safely and considerately, leaving sufficient access for emergency services to access the school or the houses on Trent Avenue, Dane Grove or Ferneydale Avenue in the event of a fire or other incident. We are considering piloting a drop off system in the new school year – more information to follow in September.

SPORT

Hello all, I will start with the big news. We have achieved the Gold Standard Sports award from the school games mark body which is a fantastic!

P.E. in school has been a great success this year. The new curriculum which we designed last year has moved away from sport specific topics to a more physical literacy-based approach. This is to engage and develop ALL pupils and inspire a love for being active into our children.

Pupils have given feedback that lessons are even more fun, and they are enjoying the new approach. We will continue this next academic year leaning more to the physical literacy side.

We have had a fantastic year of competitive sports also showing that the move to a less sportsbased curriculum hasn't impacted our competitive teams. We have competed in almost all the events on the calendar this year with over 90% of our year 4, 5 & 6 children attending an out of school sports event this year! We hope to get to 100% next year.

We are the High Peak champions of Basketball, Girls Football, Quad-Kids and Cross Country and Buxton Champions in all the above and many more. Our next step is to win the county finals in at least one of the sports that I am confident of for next year.

We have reintroduced our Harpur Heroes this year with all year 5 children completing a playground leadership award and being involved in break-times and lunchtime activities with KS1 children.

We have had great initiatives in school such as the daily mile, which has been successful, and Healthy Living week, which included children cycling to school and competing in different sports during the week.

Breakfast clubs have been wildly popular all year as has after- school football. Next year the school will be running our own after-school clubs offering at least three sports options and one dance.

We finished the year with some fantastic Sports Days for our children and it was great to see some fun and competitive events that the children have worked so hard on!

Lastly, we will be reworking our House system to allow for more intra school sports events during the year in September!

BREAKFAST AND AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS

From September, the following Breakfast and After School Clubs will be running in school.

Danny will be taking the sessions and there will be a charge per block of sessions, payable to school via school money.

The first block will run from week commencing 5th September 2022 to week commencing 17th October - 7 sessions.

The second block will run from week commencing 31st October to week commencing 12th December - 7 sessions.

Breakfast Club sessions are from 8.15am to 8.45am to be paid as a block of 7 at a total cost of £17.50 (£2.50 per session) payable via school money by 2nd September 2022.

After School Club, sessions are from 3.30pm to 4.30pm to be paid as a block of 7 at a total cost of £35 (£5 per session) payable via school money by 2nd September 2022.

At Breakfast Club,

Danny will be doing fitness games with the children for the following year groups:

Wednesdays - open to children in Years 3 or 4 Thursdays - open to children in Years 5 and 6

At After School Club, Danny will be doing the following:

Tuesdays - KS1 Football (for children in Y1 and Y2 only) Wednesdays - KS2 Football (for children in Y3 to Y6) Thursdays - KS2 Multi Sports (for children in Y3 to Y6)

If you would like your child to attend any of the above sessions, then please complete the form below and return to school by Monday 25th July.

Places are limited so will be allocated on a first come basis. If you complete the form, you are agreeing to pay for the sessions in one upfront payment as listed above. Unfortunately, it will not be possible to make a refund if a child does not attend one of the sessions.
